

# St. Helen Planning Committee Update #7

This is the quarterly update on the efforts of the St. Helen Planning Committee. Any comments, questions or concerns are welcome to be directed to Fr. Nelson or Deacon Dave at the Church office.

## **Relocation of Religious Education and the Outreach Ministry from the Christian Living Center (“CLC”)**

Both of these ministries continue to operate well from the currently leased space off campus. Our Outreach Office has especially done an exceptional job since their relocation. Under the leadership of Jimmy Poletis and a great group of volunteers, the new location has enabled them to serve a growing number of families in need. As a further means of serving the needs and poor in our community we continue to develop plans to have a presence in the new facility being refurbished by UP (United against Poverty).

## **Centennial and Other Renovations**

Since our last article, the first phase of the renovation of the sanctuary area has been completed, other than some minor painting and lighting adjustments. There is no definitive timetable for Phases II and III. Consideration of timing for these renovations is pending the end of the Centennial Year activity and further clarity on the proposed school building. Plans for an audio/visual screen in the sanctuary are proceeding thanks to the diligence and generosity of several parishioners.

As of this writing the renovation and laying of the Centennial Commemorative tiles at the St. Helen pavilion is being completed. It is expected that the landscaping and commemorative benches will be in place immediately thereafter and will provide an attractive, meditative setting.

In the Christian Living Center (“CLC”) the St. Francis Room (f.k.a. South Room) has undergone renovation. New windows for the CLC ground floor and outside doors have been ordered and renovation of the kitchen will be the next project in this building. As a result of the fine work of our maintenance department we now have four ministry meeting rooms in this building which have been nicely updated and have good audio/visual capabilities.



## **Development of a Master Plan**

The Committee continues to investigate through a contract with a local architect, the feasibility, design and cost of a new school building on the west side of our property (between Tallahassee and DeLeon Avenues). We expect to have enough information by the end of the summer to determine the overall feasibility.

## FROM LISA BELL / PRINCIPAL, ST. HELEN CATHOLIC SCHOOL

The educational experience at St. Helen Catholic School is designed to empower students spiritually and intellectually, and prepare them for lifelong learning. This year twenty-five 8<sup>th</sup>-grade students graduated and joined thousands of former students to become alumni. These recent graduates have each demonstrated a readiness to perform at the next academic level and are eager to transition into High School.

Here at St. Helen Catholic School our students accept stewardship as a responsibility to God and society. Whether it's a food drive for the Msgr. Nugent Community Outreach Office or helping their neighbor down the street, our students are taught to recognize their faith in big and small ways, and this year was no exception.

Jesus uniquely comes to us in the Eucharist. When he comes, we receive Him into our body and soul. We were very blessed to have thirty-five of our 2<sup>nd</sup> grade students receive the Eucharist for the first time at their First Holy Communion in April.

There were many examples of "Making Good Things Happen" during this last quarter of school. One of the highlights was a trip I took to Hope Rural School in Indiantown, Florida with 8<sup>th</sup>-grade students, Annie Fretwell, Ellie Arden, Cypress Reineke, and Elizabeth Burgener to deliver much needed school supplies that our students collected during Mission Madness week.



Our 4<sup>th</sup>-grade students under the guidance of Mrs. Lewis and Ms. Sherer did a wonderful job presenting the Living Stations of the Cross to the entire school. This was a beautiful way to reinforce our faith and tell the story of Jesus' Passion to even the youngest of our student body.

For Palm Sunday our 5<sup>th</sup>-grade students helped to prepare the palms used for Palm Sunday Mass. All of the students enjoyed the chance to play such an active and meaningful role in our parish community and expressed a deep sense of joy and self-regard in being able to contribute.

Registration for the 2019-2020 school year is in full swing. For some, the decision of elementary school is a nine-year decision. For us, it is the choice for a lifetime of learning and relationships. We are family here at St. Helen and I look forward to meeting our future members. ## LoveEd

Coleen Kelly Mast, author, speaker, teacher trainer, and radio talk show host is the author of the LoveEd program. She is one of four U.S. family-life experts invited to the Vatican by the Pontifical Council for the Family to present at an in-depth study of the *Truth and Meaning of Human Sexuality* document when it was released. In 2011, she was appointed by the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops to serve a four-year term on its National Review Board. Coleen is married to Kent, and they have five grown children.

Coleen is an international leader in the field of chastity education,

sharing her expertise and experience as a parent, mentor, teacher, and friend. She holds a Master's Degree in Health Education, and holds Secondary Teaching Certificates in four specialty fields: Theology, Health, Physical Education, and Science. She was presented with an Honorary Doctorate in Humane Letters from Quincy University. She has appeared on *Oprah!*, *Geraldo*, *Mother Angelica Live*, *60 Minutes*, and as a presenter at the *Steubenville Youth Conferences*. She hosts a weekly call-in radio program, *Mast Appeal*, on more than 500 EWTN Catholic Radio stations, including our own WDMC 920 AM. She can also be heard on Sirius Satellite Radio.

Coleen has debated the presidents of SEICUS (Sexuality Information and Education Council of the United States) and Planned Parenthood on TV, and debated ACLU (American Civil Liberties Union) on public radio. She assisted with the writing of the 1990 U.S. Bishops' document on Human Sexuality Education.

She and her husband Kent will come to our Parish in September to present the LoveEd program, all are welcome to hear the presentation. Please watch the Parish Bulletin and website for details in the weeks to come.
